COMBINE CAMPS

This event brings players together from all parts of the state as well as puts players from the same school on opposing teams for an exciting weekend of football.

FBU TEAM KENTUCKY

The Kentucky Middle School Football Association Team Kentucky is a national travel football team that competes in the Football University Middle School National Championship Tournament in grades 6, 7, 8 and 10U. Each team is comprised of 40 players and 8 coaches from all around the state of Kentucky. These players and coaches will spend 3 practice weekends together and at least one weekend at the regional host site for the first-round games. Teams that win their region will practice an additional weekend and will then play in Naples, Florida for the national championship in a weeklong event in mid-December.
